### **LCME Visit for Preliminary Accreditation**

An *ad hoc* survey team of four members visited the College of Medicine from Sunday February 21st to Wednesday February 24th.

The purpose of the visit was principally to verify the information submitted to the LCME in January. In addition to meeting with various college representatives, the team visited the proposed facilities within the Engelstad Research Building and the flagship building.

Our next steps include continued work in program development, and demonstrating patience as we await a June 2016 decision.

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
### **Guest Speaker and Participants Attend College of Medicine Faculty Development Session**

## Clinical Teaching Skills Highlighted at Faculty Development Event

Clinical skills teaching tips were the big topic at a session designed for our future clinical faculty, held on February 18th. Participants included family medicine physicians and other health care providers, and the event was co-hosted with the Nevada Academy of Family Physicians.

Dr. Penn, Founding Dean, welcomed the attendees and Dr. Tom Hunt, Professor and Chair of the Department of Family Medicine, led participants through teaching tips. These included the "one-minute preceptor," a tool developed 20 years ago that remains a foundational skill for preceptors of any discipline working with medical students. Additional sessions will be scheduled for clinical faculty that will include the skills needed by faculty engaged in medical student education.
