Thank you to the participants of the three-part session on item writing. Participants were able to learn about item structure, best practices in writing, crafting learning objectives related to examination questions, and to comment on NBME Comprehensive Basic Science Examination questions. Roseman medical students will be taking this standardized examination multiple times during their program, to assess their progress and preparation for the licensing USMLE Step 1.

Interprofessional education is moving forward at Roseman University.

Representatives from each of the four Roseman colleges traveled to Herndon, VA on October 7-9 to participate in the session "Interprofessional Education Institute: Building a Framework for Collaboration" sponsored by the IPE Collaborative. The Collaborative seeks to promote efforts that would advance substantive interprofessional learning experiences to help prepare future health professionals for enhanced team-based care of patients and improved population health outcomes.

The Roseman team (Dr. Augusta Arato/CON, Dr. Chris Burns/COM, Dr. Aaron Ferguson/COD, Dr. Erik Jorvig/COP) spent three days working together learning about IPE at other institutions and discussing how this can help Roseman develop IPE within the College of Medicine.
